Old Business		
Align Mission with Capabilities Creating a Healthier Eastern Shore	Topic: We focus on obesity and tobacco use, which accounts for 75% of the U.S. spending (\$2.5 trillion) on medical care. Other Shore health issues exist: social determinants, breast cancer, and mental health. Do we address these? Do we write a white paper analysis of health issues and circulate? Do we coordinate a Shore-wide analysis of health issues/needs that includes Health Dept., CSB, Hospital required reports and plan for a future process in which all institutions share resources for a more specific and better outcome?	 Remain focused on root causes of chronic diseases: obesity and tobacco use.
	 Broadening our scope carries the risk of losing focus. We should also be careful not to duplicate other coalitions and organizations efforts. We should continue to take a policy, systems and environmental change approach. That framework makes our work unique, reducing redundancy with other organizations or coalitions. The three community health surveys: Health Department, CSB and Riverside Shore Memorial Hospital community surveys can provide guidance on issues to pursue, but no one organization can address all issues. (Side note: in future we should encourage all three entities to combine resources for one Shore-wide health survey) (Side note: a meeting of all coalitions should be convened by a neutral party, perhaps the Health Department, to introduce everyone to the work that each coalition pursues). A reduction in people seeking preventive care due to the economy may result in sicker people using health resources at the most expensive end of the scale. ESHC may find opportunity here to increase population-based prevention efforts. Continuing to address obesity and tobacco use gets at the root cause of chronic diseases—diseases that account for 75% of all US health costs. Conclusion: The fight to reduce tobacco use has taken decades. We're only a few years into addressing obesity. Perhaps we should stay the course. 	

Encourage leadership among partners Recruitment <i>Membership Leadership</i>	 Membership recruitment: Who is missing from the table? (What sector, what do our current initiatives need?) Missing sectors include mental health and business. It was suggested that we approach Dr. Mark Freeze (Executive Director of the Community Services Board) and/or Dr. McLane (CSB Medical Director). Business is currently represented by Aileen Joeckel (Blue Crab Bay Co.) and we need to expand business membership. It was also suggested that we should consider members from other coalitions and from a more diverse geography. Executive Committee recruitment. Shore leaders are well-known and repetitively tapped for boards. Retired leaders are also willing to serve and may have more time. Caution must be used to detect those with agendas as our work requires having an open mind. Members are needed from across sectors and across geographies. When approaching organizations, perhaps they may provide resumes of those who would consider representing them. The need is immediate. Inviting new people on our Executive Committee who have not yet learned the PSE framework is a challenge because we are asking them to lead using this concept. We should rotate leadership among the larger towns. Lost opportunity noted: debriefing past superintendents for strategy on best ways to connect with them and communicate essential relevance.
